
WHAT IS CEP?




- The Community Eligibility Provision of the National School Lunch and School Breakfast programs provides breakfast and lunch to all students at no charge
- U.S.D.A. Federal Nutrition Programs
- Administered by the Virginia Department of Education- Office of School and Community Nutrition
- Outlined in VDOE Superintendent's Newsletter on May 9, 2023- Article 2024-19 174
- Detailed in SCNP Director's memo #2023-2024-74 on April 25, 2024, and webinar


CEP IN VIRGINIA: SCHOOLS AND STUDENTS




Total Students in CEP Schools

PARTICIPATION: SCHOOLS AND STUDENTS



GUIDELINES

 Participating eligible schools must offer breakfast and lunch at no cost to all students



Schools must have an identified student percentage of at least 25% as of April 1, 2024, to be eligible

- Identified student percentage (ISP)
- Identified students divided by enrollment determines ISP
 - Identified Students -free eligible without a meal application
- ISP x 1.6 Multiplier = % of meals claimed at the Federal free rate

Final Rule Updates to CEP

CEP - Increasing Options for Schools

CHANGES TO CEP REGULATIONS

- Minimum ISP for participation lowered to 25% (7 CFR 245.9(f))
 - Effective SY 2024-2025
 - Based on April 1, 2024, identified student percentage (ISP)
 - Individual school, groups of schools, or divisionwide
- USDA regulations require CEP participation to be at the discretion of the local school board. More information about state legislation on CEP participation is available in Superintendent's Memo No. 063-23
- Financial viability
- Evaluate before decision-making

PLANNING AND IMPLEMENTATION GUIDANCE

Updated February 2024

- Changed minimum thresholds for electing CEP
- Added Medicaid DC, fee waivers, unpaid meal charges, and Summer EBT
- Clarified eligibility and reimbursement for CEP schools operating SSO
- Clarified the funding available to support CEP (page 39)
 - Federal reimbursement
 - Including unused SFSP and CACFP At-Risk reimbursement
 - Non-federal funds
 - Nonprogram revenue (a la carte, catering, etc.)
 - State funds (state lunch reimbursement, SBP incentive, Breakfast after the Bell)
 - o Local funds, required only if federal and state funds are not sufficient to cover CEP costs

IDENTIFIED STUDENT PERCENTAGE REPORT

- SNPWeb CEP Site Eligibility Report as of April 1
- Number of identified students
 - Free without application only
 - Direct certification: SNAP, TANF, income-eligible Medicaid Free only
 - Categorical Eligibility
 - Homeless, migrant, runaway, children placed in foster care, Head Start students who are funded by the school division Head Start grant
- Number of students enrolled/membership
 - Students enrolled and attending the school with access to at least one meal daily

APRIL 1 DATA ESTABLISHES ELIGIBILITY

| ISP | Eligibility | | |
|-----------------|-----------------|--|--|
| 25.0 - 100% | Eligible | | |
| 15.0 - 24.99% | Nearly Eligible | | |
| Less than 15.0% | Not Eligible | | |

April 1 ISP is the eligibility for the following school year used in the CEP application and documentation

EVALUATING ELIGIBLE NOT PARTICIPATING

- April 1 ISP Report posted to VDOE website May 1
 - Schools 25% ISP > not currently participating in CEP
 - Identify eligible, not participating schools in your LEA
 - Evaluate all factors to inform CEP decision
 - Factors for consideration
 - Financial viability if the school adopted CEP, could it produce enough revenue to pay all expenses
 - Maintain nutritional quality
 - Administrative issues
 - Educational factors



EVALUATING CURRENT CEP SCHOOLS

- If current four-year CEP cycle ends June 30, 2024, must reapply to continue CEP
 - Refer to SNP Memo #2023-2024-59, Attachment B, Note 3 for expiring cycles
- Check individual CEP school(s) and/or group CEP ISP in SNPWeb CEP
 Schedule for SY 2024-2025 for higher ISP and new cycle year
- If individual CEP school ISP or group CEP ISP did not increase, no action needed to continue CEP cycle



CEP DATA YEAR/CYCLE YEAR

- Data Year 2019-2020: Four-year cycle expiring June 2024, new CEP application required
- Data Year 2020-2021, 2021-2022, 2022-2023: No application required to continue CEP, without changes, in year 2, 3, or 4 of cycle.
- Data Year 2023-2024: Higher ISP, new CEP application required.
- Change to CEP group(s) add schools, remove schools, etc. New CEP application required to continue CEP with new group ISP.

Decision making

- ✓ Federal reimbursement calculator enhanced to add total revenue and meal cost evaluation
- ✓ Superintendent and school board report and presentation templates



Communication

- ✓ Media release
- ✓ Household notifications



Implementation

- ✓ Engagement school staff, community
- ✓ Increase participation meal quality, serving times, alternate serving models, and customer service

DATA DRIVEN DECISION MAKING

- Use the calculator data, or your own financial analysis tools for revenue, expenditure, and per meal equivalent costs, to evaluate.
- Communicate data points to LEA decision makers to support the case for CEP adoption
- Use calculator BEP data to document need for local funds, if necessary
- Low ISP schools (<40%) may require local funds to break even



CEP MEAL PARTICIPATION INCREASES IN VA

| ADP Increases | ISP Range for School or Group | 40 to 44.9% | 45 to 49.9% | 50 to 54.9% | 55 to 62.4% | 62.5%+ |

| Breakfast | Minimum | 11.5% | 9.0% | 10.5% | 5.5% | 5.0% |
| | Maximum | 23.0% | 18.0% | 21.0% | 11.0% | 10.0% |
| Lunch | Minimum | 13.0% | 8.0% | 9.5% | 4.5% | 2.5% |
| | Maximum | 26.0% | 16.0% | 19.0% | 9.0% | 5.0% |

EVALUATING CEP FOR NEW PARTICIPATING

- Required for schools newly participating in CEP
- NEW Federal Reimbursement and Financial Viability Calculator for Virginia
 - Estimates of federal reimbursement after CEP adoption with participation escalator
 - Additional tabs for estimating total revenue, total expenditures, and total per meal cost
 - SNPWeb Annual Financial Report for most recent completed full year used
 - Revenue and expenditure estimator for SY 2024-2025 application will use annual financial report for SY 2022-2023.
 - Federal reimbursement calculator for SY 2024-2025 will use annual meal counts for SY 2022-2023 or October meal counts for SY 2023-2024



VIRGINIA CALCULATOR ENHANCEMENTS

- Additional Federal Reimbursement Calculator spreadsheet tab for mixed groups with new and existing CEP schools
- Revenues spreadsheet to estimate total revenue sources
- Expenses spreadsheet to estimate total expenditures
- Financial Summary spreadsheet summarizing data from all tabs.
 - Analysis of estimates for revenue, expenditures, total per meal equivalent (MEQ) cost, and breakeven point (BEP).



FUNDING TO SUPPORT CEP

- Funding available to support CEP (CEP Planning and Implementation Guidance page 39)
 - Federal reimbursement
 - Including unused SFSP and CACFP At-Risk reimbursement
 - Non-federal funds
 - Nonprogram revenue (a la carte, catering, etc.)
 - State funds (state lunch reimbursement, SBP incentive, Breakfast after the Bell)
 - Local funds, required only if federal and state funds are not sufficient to cover CEP costs

Next Steps

What should I do **now** to **prepare** for CEP in **SY 2024-2025**?

- ✓ Check the May 1 ISP report for eligible schools.
- ✓ Evaluate financial viability and other impacts for eligible schools.
- ✓ Communicate with LEA leadership.
- ✓ Collaborate with your VDOE SNP regional specialist.
- ✓ Make an informed decision on CEP participation or expansion.
- ✓ Application memo will be published 5/16.
- ✓ Apply by June 30, 2024, if financially viable.
- ✓ Submission is approved pending data verification

PLAN FOR CEP SUCCESS



Engage

LEA and school staff for innovation and problem solving



Communicate

frequently with SFA and school staff, students, parents/guardians, and the community



Re-calibrate

meal service and meal counting, adjust staffing, menus, and physical layout to maximize participation and efficiency

Use a variety of communication channels to reach all audiences for awareness and growing student participation

REQUIRED NOTIFICATIONS

- Household notification of CEP and meals at no cost for all students
 - Eliminate Free and Reduced-price Meal Application prohibited from collecting meal applications from CEP participating schools
- Media Release
